Respected Sir,

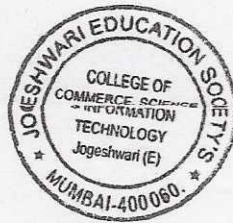

## Consolidated Feedback for the Curriculum B.Sc.I.T. 2022 – 2023

The teachers of BSc. I.T. gave their feedback for the syllabus.

On a 4-point rating scale of excellent, very good, good and poor, 11 questions along with recommendations were answered. The analysis of the feedback given of 4 programs is as follows.

**Feedback for curriculum by faculties:** - All the faculty members of B.Sc.I.T. section of Jogeshwari Education Society's College of Commerce Science and Information Technology has filled the feedback form. All the faculty member expressed positive response for present syllabus being suitable to course taught, adherence to aims and objectives of the syllabus, balance between theory and application, involvement of students' interest in the courses taught, prescribe books and journal by the university, sequencing of units/chapters, ability to use different teaching methods in class and building a bridge between industry and academics. However, 21 percent faculty members stated that they are not able to complete the syllabus in time. 7 percent faculty members also mentioned that there is need to updated the curriculum.

Recommendation by Faculties;

1. Examples and case study to be part of the syllabus.
2. Python programming must be the part of last year.
3. Reduce the syllabus, that will help to complete it within limited time.
4. Concept of JAVA Database connectivity must be the part of the syllabus.

**Feedback for curriculum by F.Y.B.Sc.I.T. students:** - The feedback on the curriculum is collected from FYBSc.IT students through the Google Form. Out of 60 students, 57 filled out the google form. The overall analysis said that the students are happy with the curriculum. 55 percent of students felt that the syllabus was fair enough to meet the demand. Overall, 57 percent of learners gave feedback as very good towards syllabus cover in the classroom. Most of the students felt that the curriculum met their expectations. Many of the students, i.e., 54 percent, perhaps feel that there is an opportunity to go for higher studies. Students have a positive attitude towards faculty who use different methods while teaching.

**Feedback for curriculum by S.V.R.Sc.I.T. students:** - All the students of SYBSc.IT responded to their feedback about the syllabus through a Google Form. About 60 percent of students opinions are very good and 30 percent are excellent towards the syllabus, which was met well to meet the demand. On average, 40 percent of students responded that they had enough time to cover the syllabus. About 50 percent of students, i.e., felt that the course curriculum fulfilled their expectations. 60 percent of students think that after completing the





course, they can pursue higher studies. Learners also gave feedback about the Various teaching methods used by teachers, and they felt that their problems were solved by the teachers. Out of all students, 50 percent felt that the assessment pattern measured their complete knowledge.

**Feedback for curriculum by T.Y.B.Sc.IT. students:** - All the students of TYBSc.IT responded to their feedback about the syllabus through a Google Form. About 53 percent of students believe that the syllabus was enough to meet the demand. About 40 percent of students responded that they had enough time to cover the syllabus. About 47 percent of students felt that the course curriculum fulfilled their expectations. They also think that after completing the course, they can pursue higher studies. Learners also gave feedback about the Various teaching methods used by teachers, and they felt that their problems were solved by the teachers. 53 percent of students gave excellent feedback, and 33 percent gave very good feedback. 40 percent felt that the assessment pattern measured your complete knowledge.

**Feedback for curriculum by JES Alumni:** - From all streams 90 students responded their feedback through a Google Forms. About 99 percent of the alumni opined that depth of the course including the project work was Excellent and Good. Also, these 99 percent alumni felt that the course offered by the institution was applicable and relevant to real life situations also they rated institution high on learning values. While only 1 percent said that depth of the course content was not up to the mark. 97 percent of alumni felt that the course was effectively covered by the organization. While 3 percent didn't find it effective. 98 percent of the alumni found the teaching abilities of the faculties were Excellent and Good while only 2 percent were not satisfied 97 percent of the alumni were happy with the learning environment provided by the institution.

**Feedback for curriculum by Employer:** - All the employers were satisfied with the theoretical knowledge of the students. While 48 percent of employers shared an excellent opinion. 58 percent of employers were very happy with the practical application of knowledge shown by employees. While other employers were satisfied. All the employers felt that the students had developed various skills. 95 percent of the employers said that the students/ alumni have good IT skills. While 5 percent have said that their employees have poor IT skills. All the employees felt that the students / alumni had very good communication skills.
