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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Founder of the Institute

Mr. Shantaram Ganaba Warty

4th September 1887 – 2nd September 1939

Nobel laureate Dr Amartya Sen said if the society is to prosper financially, it is necessary to make educational progress first. The foresight of our ancestors was so vast that they realized this fact a hundred years ago. No matter where they settled, they could not stay at peace without starting a school or educational institution. In many places like Sadashivgad, Karwar, Majali, Halge, Avarsa, Ankola, educational institutions started by their relatives have been imparting knowledge to thousands of children. How can the residents of Saraswati Bagh be an exception? The first two classes of secondary school (now fifth and sixth) were started in Saraswati Bagh in the year 1932 and the initiative was taken by the great educationist Shri. Shantaram Ganaba Warty.

Shri Warty passed Matriculation examination in 1902. He graduated with B.A. from Wilson College in 1908. He then spent four years as a teacher at the renowned Gibb High School in Kumta. He completed his M.A. in History and Economics in 1915. That caravan Gaud Saraswat Brahmin the first M.A. He was eloquent, passionate and outspoken. He was a prolific writer, orator and expert in Economics and Sociology. In 1920, he convened the Canara District Conference under the chairmanship Sir Narayanrao Chandavarkar. He became president of the Canary Primary Teachers' Conference in 1922. He was the Honorary Secretary of the Bombay Presidency Postmen's Union. He penned down the biography of the first LLB who became a judge later, Sri Vyankatrao Vaikuntha Wagh.

He got acquainted with the management of Mumbai Municipal Schools and later wrote six articles in this regard in the Times of India in 1924, pointing out its shortcomings and suggesting what improvements should be made. The articles were later published into a book and since 1924, elementary school reform has begun. He used to write on social, political and economic issues in various magazines as well as Hindi and English dailies. His proficiency in writing showed a variety of emotions with a perfect balance. He published a book titled "Sister India" in 1928 in response to Miss Catherine Mayo's book "Mother India" his respect and pride for Hindi women.

In 1935, he published a book, "What is Wrong with Bombay University", and criticized the hollow educational policy of the university. He was the editor of Indian World, a magazine started by Alembic Chemical Works in Baroda in July 1938. The company acknowledged that this enhanced the company's standing,

His illustrious journey came to an end on September 2, 1939.

In 2005, Second Floor of AGHS was constructed for serving the Higher Education needs. To meet the demands of the young students in the vicinity JES Junior College of Commerce & Science, managed by Jogeshwari Education Society was established in the year 2008 - 09 with the sole objective of creating teachers and students with noble and elevating quality. Our prestigious institution is an agent for dissemination of knowledge and culture and is an epitome of hopes and aspirations for numerous students for the past ten years. Today our institution takes pride in imparting high-quality education, integrated with values and technology. Although the College run by the Society has a short history, the academic achievements of the students speak for the quality education imparted by the Institution.

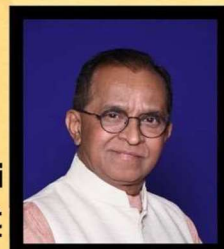

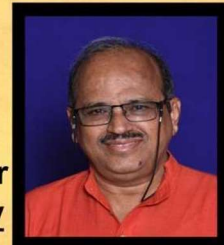

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

A candidate seeking admission to the three year degree course of the Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of Science in IT must have passed H.S.C (Std. XII) examination conducted by any Divisional Board of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with vocational subjects / minimum competency based vocational course conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed the examination of any other Board or Body recognized as equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination conducted by other states.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. University of Mumbai Pre Registration form 2024-2025 must be filled in: <https://muugadmission.samarth.edu.in>

JES College of Commerce Science and IT with the College Code 956 to be selected. Take the hard copy / soft copy of the pre-registration form 2024-25 and keep it ready before you proceed.

2. Students are required to fill in the College Admission Form and select the subjects or group of subjects as per their choice; the details of which are given in the College Prospectus. Students must affix 2 (Two) photographs on the College Admission Form in the boxes provided.
3. Students must apply separately for each course, if he/she desires.
4. Pre-admission: Students must submit the following in the College Office
 - (a) Duly filled in printout of the Pre-Admission Enrolment form must be downloaded from the University Website;
and
 - (b) Duly filled in the College Admission Form. He /She will receive token/ receipt, which will be required for confirming his/her Admission after the Merit List.

Note: No Originals or photocopies of documents need to be submitted at this stage.

5. Merit lists will be put up and displayed by the College as per the University of Mumbai schedule.
6. Admission Confirmation: Once student's name appears in the College merit list, he/she must immediately contact the College office to confirm the admission. For this, he/she must carry-

- (a) Admission Token / Receipt;
 - (b) Original documents with the required number of photocopies; and
 - (c) Demand Draft favouring “JES College of Commerce, Science and IT” as per the fee structure of the course; details of which are given in the College Prospectus.
7. On verification by the Admission Committee, the student should pay the required amount of fees in the Accounts Office and collect the Fee Receipt as confirmation of admission. The original Fee Receipt must be carefully preserved.
 8. If a student fails to confirm his/her admission as stated above, his/her name will not be considered in the subsequent merit lists.

Important: All admissions are provisional and done strictly on merit basis. Admission is confirmed on the basis of submission of original documents, scrutiny and approval of Admission Committee and payment of fee as mentioned.

Note: The Admission Forms for FY Programmes in JES College of Commerce, Science and Information Technology and the Prospectus are also available on the College Website for reference. Hard copy of the same will be issued at pre-admission.

Documents Required:

- From the University website downloaded printout of duly filled online Pre-Admission Enrolment Form.
- Duly filled in College Admission Form
- Original standard XII Mark sheet with 3 (Three) self-attested photocopies
- Original Junior College Leaving Certificate with 3 (Three) self-attested photocopies
- One self-attested photocopy each, of the Standard X Mark sheet and Passing Certificate.
- Provisional Eligibility Certificate (Applicable only for students from other than Maharashtra State Board)
- Migration Certificate (Applicable only for students from other than Maharashtra State Board)
- One self-attested photocopy each, of Aadhaar card and PAN Card.
- Two passport size photographs of the student (Frontal view of the face against white background)
- GAP Certificate (Joint Affidavit) of the student and either of the parents on a Rs 100/- stamp paper, if there is a break of more than a year in the academic career after passing Std XII (draft of GAP Certificate will be provided).

Important note:

1. The right of making subject combinations and the choice of electives mentioned in all faculties is vested with the principal, depending upon the demand of subjects and electives from students.
2. The number of seats for different subjects and elective combination will be decided by the principal.
3. Subject(s) and elective(s), which do not have the minimum enrolment required by the Government/University, will not be offered.
4. Examination of Semester I, II, III & IV will be conducted by the college on half of the University of Mumbai as per the University schedule, rules, regulations and guidelines, while examinations of Semester V & VI will be conducted by the University of Mumbai.

DISCIPLINARY RULES AND REGULATION

Students joining the College must strictly abide by the Rules and Regulations of the College.

1. Every student must wear the Identity Card with his / her Photograph attested and basic personal information with Blood Group if he / she is in the College premises.
2. If any student found guilty in any incident of ragging, strict disciplinary action against him / her will be initiated by the concerned Authorities.
3. The student must not loiter in the College Premises while the classes are going on.
4. Smoking & Consumption of alcohol in the College premises or entering after consuming alcoholic drinks to the College is strictly prohibited.
5. No student shall collect any money or contribution for Picnic, Trips, Educational Visits to any Place, Get-together, Study Notes, charity or any other Activities without prior permission of the principal.
6. Students are expected to take proper care of the College Property and help the College Authorities in keeping the Premises clean. Damaging College Property (like furniture & fittings / misuse of AC etc.) is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished.
7. Students should not leave their books, valuables and other belongings in the classroom.
8. It is the responsibility of the students to read the Notice Boards regularly for important announcements made by the College Office from time to time.
9. Use of Mobile Phone and hand devices are not allowed in the class. The devices shall be confiscated, in case any student is found guilty. In case any faculty uses it as mode of teaching, it is allowed.
10. Students using unfair means at examination will not be readmitted to the College. Action will be initiated against such students as per the norms and procedure prescribed by the University of Mumbai.
