Agenda Item No 1: Review and approval of minutes of the meeting held on 26th October 2024.

Dr. Prashant H Shelar welcomed all present members of CDC for the meeting and this was followed by running through the minutes of previous meeting of CDC held on 26th October 2024, which was approved by the members without any changes.

Agenda Item No. 2: Presentation of the College Activity Report by the I/C Principal

Dr. Prashant H. Shelar began by highlighting a significant development in the current academic year—the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) as per the directives of the University. In compliance with the new norms, Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) IDs have been successfully created for all students, which is now a mandatory requirement.

Academic Initiatives:

 The college has adhered to the university's examination schedules. Time tables for regular and ATKT examinations have been prepared. Semester II regular exams will begin from 5th April 2025, and FY Semester I (NEP) ATKT exams are scheduled for May 2025. Results are expected by the third week of May 2025, enabling a smooth admission process for the upcoming academic year.

Publications & Extracurricular Activities:

In addition to the regular college magazine ABHAY, independent magazines from DLLE, NSS, and WDC were successfully published.

A picnic for students and faculty was organized with all necessary safety measures in

Student Engagement & Internships:

Students were placed in two-month internships, and many continue to pursue them.

MoUs were signed with colleges and NGOs to host seminars, workshops, and Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Institutional Developments:

Form 12B and 2F have been submitted to the University and the UGC; queries are being addressed.

A moment of pride: six faculty members from the Degree College have been awarded

Ph.D. degrees from JJTNU, Rajasthan.

Recognitions & Celebrations:

The Prize Distribution Ceremony for academics, sports, DLLE, and NSS is scheduled for 7th March 2025, followed by the Farewell for T.Y. students on 10th March 2025.

· This year, 100 students received scholarships from institutions such as Akshara Foundation, Association of Non-Government Colleges (Mumbai), Government of Maharashtra, and the Rotary Club of Sher-e-Punjab.

DLLE Achievements:

The JES DLLE Wing under the University of Mumbai saw 150 student registrations. Events like T-shirt Painting (Warli & Mandala Art) and Blackboard Decoration on Independence Day were enthusiastically received.

· At University Fest UDAAN, 20 students competed in events such as Powada Singing. Street Play, Creative Writing, Elocution, and Poster Making. The team won 3rd place

in Powada Singing.

A Food Mela was organized to mark Marathi Bhasha Divas.

NSS Activities:

- The NSS wing with two active units organized events like: Polio Awareness Camp, Raksha Bandhan with Police Officers, Paper Bag Making, Blood Donation Camp. Beach Cleanup Drive, Harmony Rally, Street Plays on Social Issues, Yoga Day Celebration, Sanvi Dhan Amrut Mahotsav.
