Highlights of Activities:

- Students' involvement at voting centres for Maharashtra Assembly elections: College students were mobilized by the State Election Commission (SEC) to serve as polling day volunteers at 158-Jogeshwari East Constituency and 165-Andheri West Constituency. Students' involvement included assisting election officials with nonsensitive logistical tasks, guiding voters especially the senior citizens and divyang (differently-abled) to designated areas, and helping manage queues to ensure smooth crowd movement.
- Celebration of Constitution Day: The program commenced with a collective reading of the Preamble to the Constitution. Both, staff and students took part in this meaningful activity, reaffirming their dedication to the core values and principles
