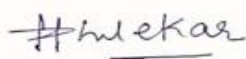
22 November 2025 - Nature Walk at Trimandir

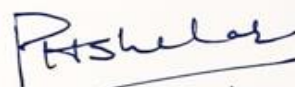
15 December 2025 - Eco-Friendly Green Christmas
