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ANNUAL REPORT 2025-2026

IOAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

During the academic year 2025–26, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted regular meetings to monitor and enhance academic and institutional quality. The Cell reviewed AQAR progress, departmental achievements, audits, and institutional policies while approving the revised Vision, Mission, and Core Values by incorporating Artificial Intelligence, Innovation, and Environmental Sustainability. It also focused on strengthening research, student support services, library resources, digital infrastructure, industry collaborations, campus cleanliness, and the effective implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP).

The institution actively promoted a culture of research and innovation by encouraging faculty members and students to participate in national and international conferences. Financial and academic support enabled participants to present research papers, collaborate with experts, and enhance publication opportunities. The IQAC also approved the implementation of the MasterSoft ERP system, expansion of digital learning resources such as DELNET, and IT infrastructure upgrades, reaffirming the institution's commitment to continuous quality improvement, academic excellence, and institutional effectiveness.

Examination Department

During the academic year 2025–26, the Examination Committee successfully managed examinations under both the National Education Policy (NEP) framework for First and Second Year students and the Old Syllabus for Third Year students. Internal and external examinations for Semester I and III were conducted in August and October 2025, while Semester II and IV examinations, along with ATKT examinations for Semesters I–IV, were successfully organized during February and March 2026. Practice examinations for TY Semester V were also conducted to prepare students for university examinations.

The college efficiently functioned as a Mumbai University Examination Centre for Third Year Semester V and VI examinations across B.Com., B.A.F., B.M.S., and B.Sc. I.T. programmes. All examination-related activities, including mark compilation, uploading of marks on the Samarth Portal, and result declaration, were completed accurately and within the prescribed timelines, ensuring smooth and transparent examination administration.



Student Council

The Student Council of JES College successfully organized a variety of academic, cultural, and student-centric activities during the academic year 2025–2026. Major programmes included the FY Orientation Programme, Freshers Get-Together, Investiture Ceremony, Prize Distribution Ceremony, Farewell Day, and Convocation Ceremony, providing students with opportunities for leadership, participation, and personal growth.

Through these initiatives, the Student Council promoted leadership, teamwork, discipline, confidence, and a sense of belonging among students. The programmes enriched campus life, encouraged active student participation, and reflected the institution's commitment to the holistic development of every learner.

Training & Placement Cell

The Training and Placement Cell of JES College actively worked towards enhancing students' employability and strengthening industry-academia collaboration during the academic year 2025–2026. The Cell signed **10 MoUs**, organized **37 workshops**, conducted **2 placement drives** with the participation of **14 companies**, and provided **on-the-job training** to over **90 students**, benefiting more than **500 students** through various career-oriented initiatives.

The Cell conducted workshops, guest lectures, certification programmes, soft skills training, resume building sessions, LinkedIn profile development, mock interviews, assessments, and industrial visits to equip students with industry-relevant knowledge and practical skills. A total of **102 students** participated in placement drives, and **48 students** successfully secured employment opportunities. Through these initiatives, the Training and Placement Cell significantly enhanced students' career readiness, professional skills, and employment prospects, reflecting its commitment to preparing learners for successful careers.

Research Cell

During the academic year 2025–2026, the Research Cell organized a series of academic initiatives to promote research aptitude and strengthen the research culture among students and faculty members. Major activities included an Orientation Programme on Research Methodology for undergraduate and postgraduate students and a workshop on "How to Prepare the Black Book" for final-year self-finance students, providing practical guidance on research methodology, report writing, referencing, and ethical research practices.

The Research Cell also organized a One-Day National Conference for Faculty in collaboration with St. Rocks College and Ghanshyamdas Jalan College, where 100 faculty members participated and 76 research papers were presented and published. In addition, a One-Day National Conference for Students provided a platform for 51 student researchers to present their work and interact with experts. These initiatives enhanced research awareness, encouraged scholarly publications, and reaffirmed the institution's commitment to fostering research, innovation, and academic excellence.



NSS (National Service Scheme)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of JES College of Commerce, Science and Information Technology organized a wide range of environmental, health, community service, and personality development activities during the academic year 2025–2026. Major initiatives included cleanliness drives, tree plantation, blood donation and health check-up camps, HIV/AIDS awareness programmes, national day celebrations, leadership and skill development workshops, and various community outreach activities. A key highlight was the **7-Day Special Residential Camp** at Kokner Village, Palghar, where volunteers actively participated in village development and social service initiatives.

Through these programmes, the NSS Unit promoted environmental sustainability, health awareness, leadership, teamwork, patriotism, and social responsibility. Guided by its motto, **"Not Me, But You,"** the unit made a meaningful contribution to society while fostering the holistic development of students and encouraging them to become responsible and compassionate citizens.

DLLE (Department of Life Long Learning & Extension)

The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE) of JES College of Commerce, Science and Information Technology organized various extension, environmental, social awareness, cultural, and personality development programmes during the academic year 2025–2026. Major activities included environmental drives, International Yoga Day, Kargil Vijay Diwas, Cyber Security Workshop, Food Mela, Blood Donation Camp, Voters Awareness Rally, creative competitions, and community outreach programmes. The department also participated in the **150th Anniversary of Vande Mataram** and achieved **Second Prize in the Powada Singing Competition at UDAAN Fest 2026**.

Through these initiatives, the DLLE Department promoted leadership, communication skills, environmental awareness, patriotism, teamwork, entrepreneurship, and social responsibility, contributing significantly to students' holistic development and community engagement.

Cultural Committee

Gymkhana Department

The Gymkhana Department had a highly successful academic year 2025–2026 by organizing a wide range of sports and fitness activities that promoted teamwork, discipline, and sportsmanship. Major events included International Yoga Day, Sports Orientation Programme, Carrom, Badminton, Chess, BGMI Competitions, Annual Sports Day, and several sports events conducted for the first time, including Staff Sports Day, Physical Fitness Week, and Management Sports Day.

Entrepreneurship Cell

Nature's Club

Rotary Club

Statutory Committee

The Statutory Committees are constituted to receive, examine, and redress grievances submitted by students in accordance with the legal directives. The proceedings and resolutions are documented through the Minutes of the Meeting (MoM), while maintaining confidentiality of the complainant and other concerned individuals, wherever required.

Each Statutory Committee conducts a minimum of two meetings during every academic year. The first meeting is held at the beginning of the academic year to review the committee's roles and action plan, and the second meeting is held at the end of the academic year to review its activities and ensure compliance with statutory requirements.

WDC (Women Development Cell)

During the academic year 2025–2026, the Women's Development Cell (WDC) organized a variety of educational, health, and skill development programmes to empower girl students and promote their overall well-being. Activities included an Orientation Programme, awareness sessions on menstrual hygiene, PCOD, cervical cancer, and self-care, a cooking workshop, and the distribution of sanitary napkins to encourage health and hygiene. These initiatives enhanced awareness about women's health, personal development, and healthy living.

The WDC also conducted an Income Tax Return (ITR) Filing Workshop to improve financial literacy and organized an Online Quiz Competition on the occasion of International Women's Day to promote awareness of women's rights and achievements.
